

AMBASSADORS OF HOPE OPEN DOORS!

Ambassadors of Hope have a unique role in bringing Shared Hope tools to your legislators to assist them in drafting bills that will impact provision and protection for child and youth victims of sex trafficking.

Shared Hope has excellent published materials to SHARE with your state legislators or legislative aides. You have the ability to stress that juvenile sex trafficking is an important issue to you, as their constituent!

1 BEFORE YOU BEGIN

In the [action center](#) you will see if Shared Hope International is already involved in supporting a bill in your state. <https://act.sharedhope.org/actioncenter> If your state doesn't have any bills listed as actively working with Shared Hope, consider taking action on the federal bills that are listed.

We recognize there may be meaningful legislation that doesn't fit the scope of Shared Hope's report card framework. Feel free to advocate for those bills as a concerned citizen, **but not speaking as an Ambassador of Hope**, nor mentioning that you are connected to Shared Hope in any way so as not to cause confusion.

2 TAKE THE NEXT STEP TO REACH OUT

If there are [state bills](#) listed for your zip code, click on the bill you wish to advocate for. Follow prompts to connect with your legislator. Scripts are provided for tweets or emails and in some cases, phone calls.

1. Introduce yourself.
"I am a concerned citizen and trained volunteer Ambassador for Shared Hope International."
2. Identify your purpose in calling.
"I am calling to make an appointment with ___(name your lawmaker)___ to discuss ways our state laws could be stronger in addressing child and youth sex trafficking."
3. Make an appointment, and ask for a confirmation email. Forward that email to the [Director of National Outreach](#) to assist you.

3 PREPARE FOR THE MEETING

1. Share your state's grade with your legislators and ask them to fight child sex trafficking.
2. Go to <https://act.sharedhope.org/IwIeuHk> and follow the prompts to send your lawmakers a copy of their state report card.
3. Review your state grade card <https://reportcards.sharedhope.org/>.
4. Print a copy of your report card and a copy of the law analysis report to take with you to the meeting. We suggest purchasing a plain red file folder to gather information about Shared Hope to leave with your legislator or their aide. Include your Ambassador business card with your contact information.

ATTEND THE MEETING

1. Your voice is important. Give them a reason to review the materials you've brought by informing them, "As a constituent in your district, I am passionate about laws that protect and provide for victims of child and youth sex trafficking. I've brought you information from Shared Hope International to consider for our state." Tell them briefly why you care about this issue personally.

REMEMBER: Ambassadors of Hope **are not qualified to make recommendations** on legislation. Your role is to introduce your lawmaker to the Shared Hope policy team for technical assistance.

2. "To support your efforts to make our state laws more effective, I'd like to offer you the link to receive direct technical assistance from Shared Hope's policy team. You're able to fill out a request online, and someone from the Policy Team will contact you."
3. Show them the technical assistant handout in your file for <https://sharedhope.org/legislative-technical-assistance/>. Leave the information with them. Thank them for their time.

FOLLOW-UP AFTER YOUR MEETING

Time to update the SHI Team!

1. Send an email to the [Director of National Outreach](#) with information with whom you met, and any information or specific questions from the legislators. Be sure to share anything you think the policy team should know. They contact your lawmaker on your behalf.
